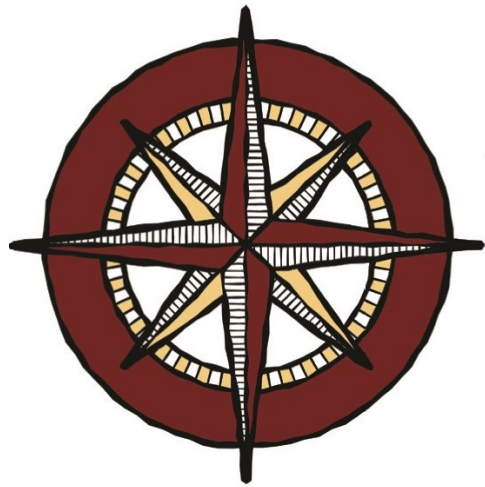

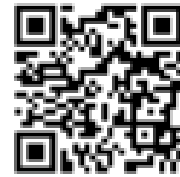

High speed multipage document scanning is now available for patrons to use—free of charge. To browse the internet more reliably, faster and safer, the library recently acquired new high speed network and dual DSL circuits. In the Com-

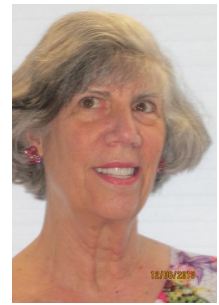

North Valley Public Library is pleased to announce that it now offers the Mango Languages online language-learning system to its patrons. Mango is free for library patrons and can be accessed anywhere with an Internet connection. Each lesson combines real life situations and audio

from native speakers with simple, clear instructions. The courses are presented with an appreciation for cultural nuance and real-world application by focusing on the four key elements of language learning: vocabulary, pronunciation, grammar, and culture. The lessons are fun!

Mango offers access to 60 foreign language courses and 17 English courses taught completely in the user’s native language. In addition to traditional language courses, Mango also offers the opportunity to learn through foreign film with Mango Premiere™ and access to a variety of specialty mini courses, like Pi-
