Tuesday, October 5



Animal Wonders provides homes to displaced exotic animals and non-releasable wildlife and offers educational outreach programs for the public.





A great foreign documentary about street cats, as well as the people that care for them in beautiful Istanbul, Turkey."




Grizzly Man


Meru

I really loved Meru, a mountain climbing movie that's gorgeous and has a lot of amazing human drama too.




National Parks: America's best idea

Wyeth, the life of Andrew Wyeth in bold strokes




Ferrante Fever




