After a long winter indoors, many of us are eager to be outside and quick to notice every new leaf, returning bird, and busy bug. Sightings like these can be scientific data which benefit research and impact policy decisions locally, nationally, and globally. After all, science needs more eyes, ears, and perspectives than any single person can provide. When nonscientists—that is, **people of all ages and backgrounds, just like us**—report their observations on topics they care about, it's called citizen science.




