


#### The Gothic Genre Thursday, Oct 26 at 6:30pm



#### WE HAVE MOBILE HOTSPOTS!



#### Do you wish you had free internet at home? Now you can!

A mobile hotspot is a portable, personal router that allows you to connect to the internet from your phone, laptop, or other WiFi enabled device.

Hotspots are easy to use and include instructions. Those with a NVPL library card can enjoy internet access from the convenience of home.

If you already use and love hotspots, please note the Board has passed some important changes to the hotspot circulation policy. Before checking out a hotspot, whether for the first time or as a frequent flyer, you will be required to review and agree to a revised Hotspot Acknowledgement Form. The revised hotspot circulation policy is described below.

#### MOBILE HOTSPOT CIRCULATION POLICY

#### Approved by the Library Board on September 20, 2023.

Mobile Hotspots are available for checkout by patrons age 18+ with full-privilege North Valley Public Library cards. Parents may consent for a minor to borrow equipment by agreeing to take financial responsibility for the equipment and fines. Consent must be granted in person.

- Hotspot checkout is for 14 days, but you can return early!
- One hotspot per household/residence/address.
- Minimum two (2) calendar days (gap days) between checkouts per household, regardless of the library card account (ex. If your housemate returns a hotspot on Monday, you can check out again on Thursday if one is available). Sorry but no exception to gap days for malfunctioning hotspots.
- Overdue hotspots are fined at \$10 per day, so be sure to return on time or early. Hotspots are turned off remotely if overdue. You will lose hotspot privileges if you are overdue multiple times.
- Your charge history will be turned on if you are a hotspot borrower. A note will be added to your record once you sign the hotspot acknowledgement form.
- Return hotspots indoors during open library hours. Hotspots may not be returned in the outdoor book drop.
- Your account must be in good standing with a \$0 balance (no fines or blocked accounts).
