progress, problem piece, or brand-new pattern and enjoy the company of like-minded crafters during this informal club.

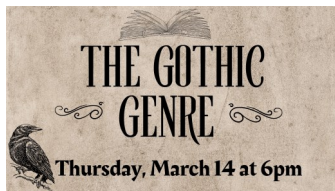


### DIY Paper Marbling

home with beautiful paper that is perfect for stationary or cards, binding into a journal, giving as a gift, and more. All materials provided.

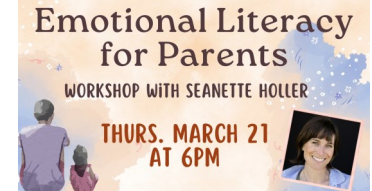


### The Gothic Genre

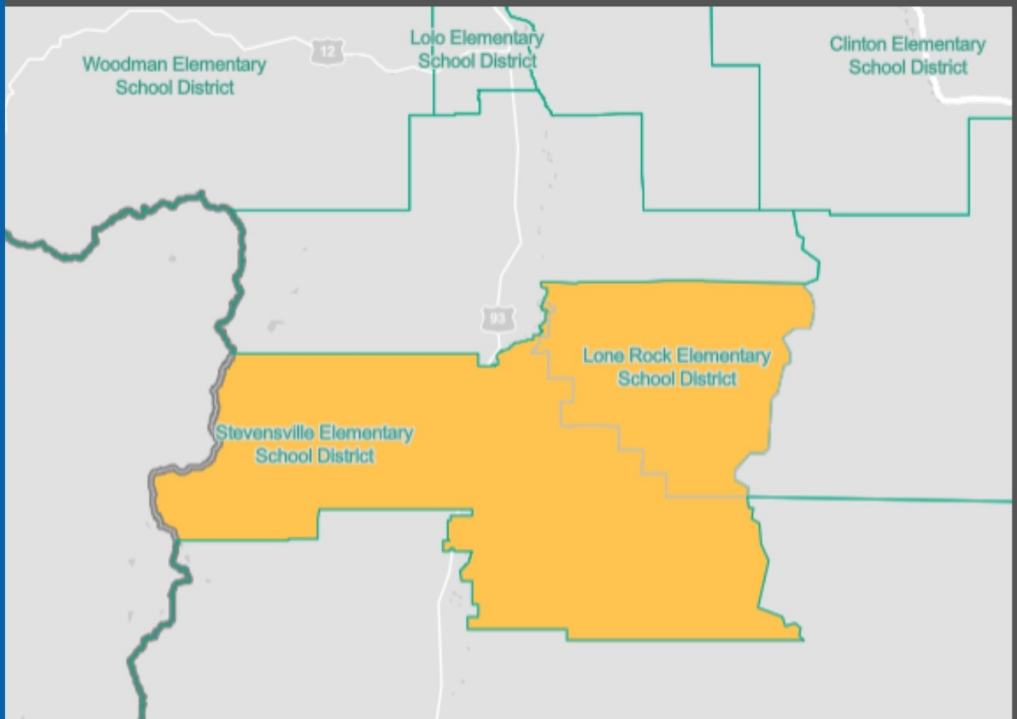
We almost lost our Library!

### Babies, Toddlers, & Preschoolers (Ages 0-5)



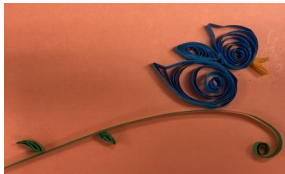

### Drop-In Craft

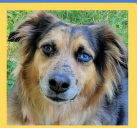
