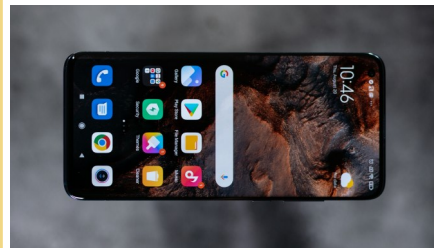
a new email account and learn how to send, receive, and reply to an email; recognize and deal with spam; organize and delete emails; and search for messages.

Bison Archeology in Glacier National Park Monday, Sept 25 at 6pm

Long ago,

before the Going to the Sun Road or the Sperry Chalet, Glacier National Park was once home to bison. While today's visitors can still experience bears, goats, and moose, the bison no longer graze in the meadows and valleys below the towering peaks. This presentation will explore what is known and not known about the bison who once roamed in these rugged mountains and the people who for centuries lived with and relied on these bison. This presentation will also review recent research into bison in Glacier, including some preliminary results which have yet to be published.

We heard many patrons requesting texts about their holds. Now it is here and you are in control to opt– in for the texts you want to receive. Read on for instructions how!

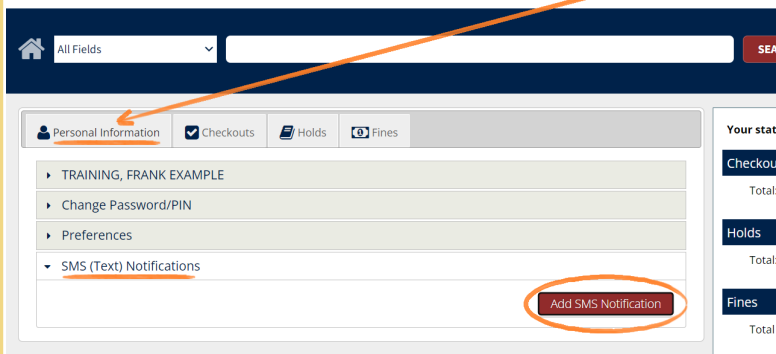

To sign yourself up SMS text notifications:

1. Visit our library's online catalog https://mtsc.ent.sirsi.net/client/en_US/NVPL
2. Click My Account.
3. Log in using your card number and password.
4. From the Personal Information tab of your account, click the SMS (Text) Notifications section.



5. Click Add SMS Notification.
6. Enter a label of your choosing, a 10-digit phone number, then choose which notices you would like to receive via text.
7. Click Save.

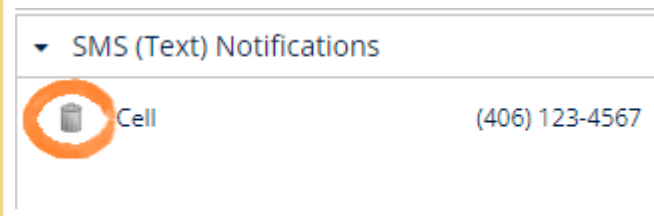
