Long ago,


before the Going to the Sun Road or the Sperry Chalet, Glacier National Park was once home to bison. While today's visitors can still experience bears, goats, and moose, the bison no longer graze in the meadows and valleys below the towering peaks. This presentation will explore what is known and not known about the bison who once roamed in these rugged mountains and the people who for centuries lived with and relied on these bison. This presentation will also review recent research into bison in Glacier, including some preliminary results which have yet to be published.

We heard many patrons requesting texts about their holds. Now it is here and you are in control to opt—in for the texts you want to receive. Read on for instructions how!




