
### **Rivers, Francine. *Shoe Box 25th Anniversary Edition.***






Three historical split-time romances. Books can be read as stand-alone or in order.


### **Peterson, Tracie. *Forever My Own.***

A new campaign is starting and new players are welcome to join. This program will be held both in person or online via Zoom. You choose. No experience necessary. Register online.




### Open World Fridays
