If you love *MontanaLibrary2Go*, you will flip over *Flipster* digital magazines. We are able to provide you with this new digital resource of 77 items thanks to the legislature reinstating State Aid funding through 2023. Both adult and juvenile titles are available.

 **The Flipster app** offers offline viewing of downloaded content on your mobile devices. To download the free *Flipster* app, search the iTunes App Store or the Google Play Store for "*Flipster* - Digital Magazines."

Via a computer, tablet, or phone: Click on the *Flipster* link on our library's website, enter your library card information, and access a site where you can browse available magazines. You can then click on a magazine to view it within your browser. This means that you can access *Flipster* from the computer library, your home computer, your phone, or your tablet, as long as you are connected to the Internet.






Welcome new staff member Nancy Bevins as Adult Services Specialist

Annika's Indian Book Review


***The Birchbark House* by Louis Erdrich**

This series is seen through the eyes of a 7-year-old Ojibwa girl, Omakayas, the sole survivor of a smallpox epidemic on Spirit Island. Only a baby girl, she was rescued by a woman named Tallow and welcomed into an Ojibwa family on Lake Superior. I would highly recommend this series for middle grade readers who enjoy historical fiction, and those who are curious to learn more about indigenous cultures.

Neither Wolf Nor Dog Film Screening

North Valley Public Library is screening the film **Neither Wolf Nor Dog** in the Community Room in recognition of **Native American Heritage Month**.

Voyaging the sparse lands of the Dakotas, *Neither Wolf Nor Dog* follows a white author who gets sucked into the heart of contemporary Native American life by a 95-year-old Lakota elder and his sidekick. Still being screened in theaters across America, this film is an adaption of the acclaimed novel *Neither Wolf Nor Dog* by Kent Nerburn.



David Bald Eagle as Dan

Witness one of the most authentic films highlighting the modern experiences of indigenous Americans. The film features the late **Chief David Bald Eagle**, a Lakota soldier and actor. Before his passing he said, "It's the only film I've been in


about my people that told the truth."

Author Kent Nerburn said of the film, "[The director] changed the book. Yes, he adapted it; yes, he augmented it. But he nailed it. The choices he made were exquisite. His film is at once different from the book and better than the book...he made a completely new work of art that honored the original work of art while carrying it to a new level. He took my literary child and made a man of it."

This film is a rare viewing opportunity and has excellent reviews with both critics and audiences in the United States and internationally.
