REFERENCE AT THE LIBRARY: CONSUMER REPORTS & MEDICARE CHOICES

MEDICARE OPEN ENROLLMENT

It's not too late to make changes to your Medicare plan for 2026.

Medicare Open Enrollment runs to December 7, and during this time, you can make changes to your existing coverage such as switching between traditional Medicare and Medicare Advantage or changing your prescription plan. (The government shutdown does not effect the Medicare open enrollment window.)

CONSUMER REPORTS REFERENCE

Remember the days when libraries had reference sections with books devoted to answering questions? The internet diminished reference areas in libraries, but there a few gems left at NVPL. One of those gems is *Consumer Reports (CR)* magazine for product and service reviews. You can find free reviews on the internet but are they trustworthy? *Consumer Reports* is an independent, nonprofit organization founded in 1936 that tests thousands of products in their labs each year. CR pays for all the products they rate, and they don't accept paid advertising.

The September/October edition has a 5-page article on Medicare stating, "As drug coverage and doctor networks change for 2026, find out which type of plan is the right fit for you-and how to avoid costly mistakes."

The article continues, "Even with guidance from the pros, it helps to be familiar with the various coverage options."

Ask a staff member for this issue of the magazine and read the full *Consumer Reports* article to help

you determine options that work best for you. Consumer Reports cannot be checked out, but you can read it in the library or make photocopies for 10c a page.

STATE HEALTH INSURANCE PROGRAM (SHIP)

Ravalli County Counsel on Aging at 310 Old Corvallis Rd, Hamilton provides SHIP Counselors that "are trained in Medicare benefits and options and have no affiliation with any insurance company." Call 406-363-5690 to make an appointment. You need to have a Medicare card to make an appointment.

The <u>Medicare</u> website is full of information at medicare.gov/health-drug-plans/open-enrollment.

NOT YET ON MEDICARE AND TURNING 65 SOON?

Timing is everything! Sign up three months before or after your birthday or face penalties.

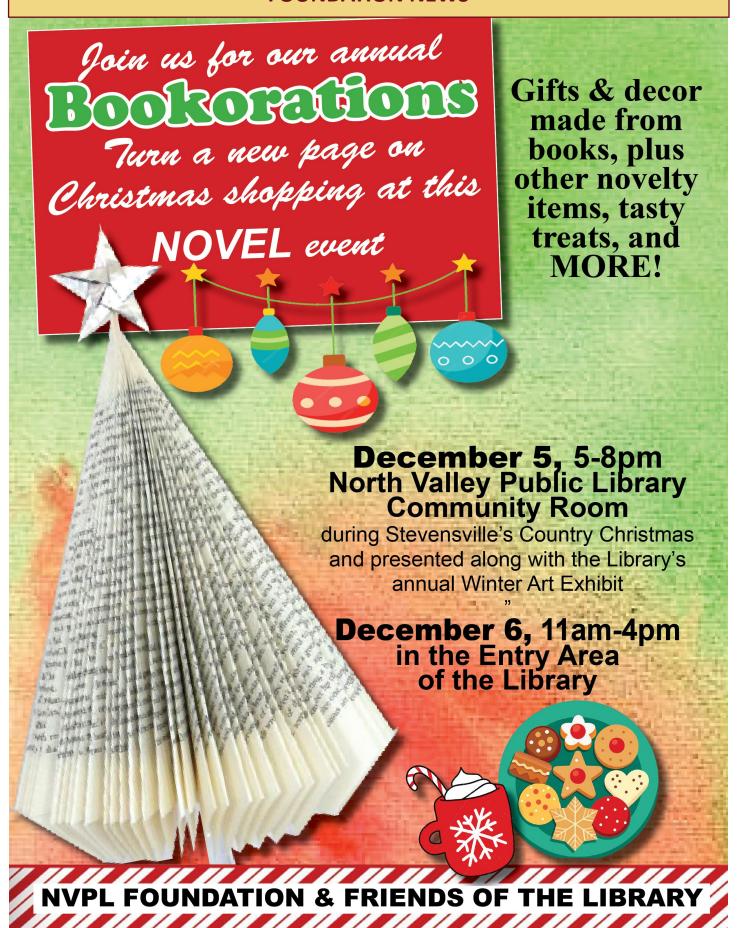
Enroll through <u>Social Security</u>. The Missoula office has one employee at 866-931-9029. Sign up for Medicare Part A (hospital) & B (doctors) regardless of your choice of traditional Medicare or Medicare Advantage. You will need Part D (medication) if you decide on traditional Medicare or if the Medicare Advantage plan you choose does not include Rx, but most do. If you go without an Rx plan for 63 days or more you will pay a penalty. A checklist for what you need is available at <u>ssa.gov/hlp/isba/10/isba-checklist.pdf</u>.
