



We are severely limited by the lack of space in our current building. There is much more to the story of the Library of Things, and, as we work towards a new facility, more to the story of NVPL.

We are hopeful that when we have a new building we can add additional useful home, yard/garden, office, and craft items that will be available for patrons to checkout such as film to digital converter pole digger, fence post remover, sawhorses, etc. We would like to offer things the average homeowner or renter needs only occasionally and would prefer not to store or purchase so it is better to check it out.


