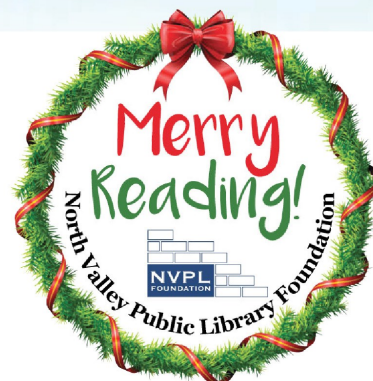

Sign yourself up for SMS Notifications in MY ACCOUNT

1. Visit our library's online catalog
https://mtsc.ent.sirsi.net/client/en_US/NVPL
2. Click My Account.
3. Log in using your card number and password/PIN.
4. From the Personal Information tab of your account, click the SMS (Text) Notifications section.
5. Click Add SMS Notification.
6. Enter a label of your choosing, a 10-digit phone number, then choose which notices you would like to receive via text.
7. Click Save.
