IndigiKitchen with Mariah Gladstone (virtual watch party) Tuesday, Jan 9 at 6:30pm


What are indigenous foods, where do we get them, and how do we prepare them? Gladstone is leading the way in a food movement that is revitalizing

NEW CHILDREN AND TEEN BOOKS

The John Henry Eldred Jr. Foundation awarded North Valley Public Library \$5,000 for new children and teen books and AV. The fund is called the Dorothy Louise Kyler Fund and was created to help grow circulation of children's materials in rural libraries across the United States.

Of the total \$6,000 budgeted for children's books, \$5,000 of it was awarded by this Foundation's fund.


